



Distribution System Planning

- ❖ The second Long-Term Load and DER Forecasting stakeholder engagement group meeting will be at Con Edison on Friday, July 14 from 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM. This session will include progress updates from the JU on forecasting efforts and continued discussions on stakeholder use cases, including potential stakeholder presentations. - ❖ During the April 28th hosting capacity webinar, stakeholders suggested additional data that would be useful. The Joint Utilities are working to determine the availability and timeline for providing these types of data to bring back in the next stakeholder meeting.

Grid Operations

- ❖ The JU-NYISO Task Force is addressing coordination issues related to registration of aggregations, mapping of DER to substation load bus transformers, operational coordination and communications. Initially the Task Force is mapping the flow of data/information necessary for coordination between the aggregator, NYISO and DSP necessary to secure the system. There will be a stakeholder engagement group scheduled later this year to review progress.

Market Operations

- ❖ In order to provide vendors a central location to find notifications of NWA opportunities and NWA RFPs, the Joint Utilities created a [page on the JU website](#) with links to utility-specific web portals. The Joint Utilities are also working with the REV Connect team to develop content for an NWA opportunities page on the REV Connect website. This information is scheduled to be available through REV Connect later this summer. To simplify user experience, the webpage on REV Connect is planned to be provided in the same format as the information available on the JU website.
- ❖ The JU are committed to forming an EV Readiness plan under the parameters developed, with significant stakeholder input, in the [Supplemental DSIP filing](#). The JU have formed a working group to focus on developing this plan, and will further engage stakeholders later this year.



Data Access

- ❖ On June 7, the JU submitted a compliance filing proposing a data privacy standard for building owners/agents' access to whole building data aggregated data in response to the [March 9 DSIP Commission Order](#). The filing can be found on the [DPS website](#).
- ❖ A full day Customer Data stakeholder session was held on May 22 in NYC. The meeting focused on 2017 objectives and implementation plans supporting commitments articulated in the Supplemental DSIP filing. The session provided a forum for discussion on proposed standards to be applied for building owner/agent access to whole building aggregated usage data and incorporation into the JU's June 7 filing. The JU also solicited input on the JU benchmarking effort regarding building data standards for public access.

- ❖ The Joint Utilities are developing a [System Data webpage](#) on the JU website that provides a catalog of JU system data that is available to the public, with links to the locations of the currently available utility-specific system data. The webpage will be published by the end of June.

Regulatory Policy

- ❖ The Joint Utilities remain focused on the transition from NEM toward a Value Stack approach to compensating DER. Preparations are underway for a DPS hosted Technical Conference on June 12 in which the Companies will provide additional detail on the contents of Phase 1 Implementation Plans (filed on May 1). The goal of this Technical Conference is to assure that stakeholders have a clear understanding of the May 1 filings when preparing comments on each company's plan (due July 10).
- ❖ The Companies are in the process of assembling plans to work with DPS Staff and other stakeholders on challenges related to Phase 2 of the transition from traditional NEM. An organizational proposal was filed on May 30.
- ❖ NYSEG and RG&E and O&R continue to engage with DPS Staff and/or stakeholders on the details of proposals the companies have made for Earnings Adjustment Mechanisms. NYSEG and RG&E expect to hear a responsive proposal from Staff and others within the next two weeks.
- ❖ The Joint Utilities are preparing for a Technical Conference to take place on June 5 on repowering of renewable resources and maintenance of renewable resources that may need additional financial support to continue operating.
